NEW NIAGARA - 2005 BUDGET SCENARIOS

Mrs. Judy Conning, Co-Chair of the Finance Budget Sub-Committee of the Financial Advisory Committee, Mr. Ian Pratt, Chair of the Financial Advisory Committee, and Mr. Robert McKinnell, Treasurer, outlined the consultative process arising from New Niagara and reviewed the five 2005 Budget Scenarios prepared in response to the budget consultations in September. Delegates were asked to discuss at their tables: Which option is MOST DESIRABLE? Why?

Which option is the LEAST DESIRABLE? Why?

Table groups were asked to provide written feedback using the forms provided. Each member was asked to indicate their FIRST and SECOND choices and table groups were asked to document the rationale in favour of top two choices at their table.

The results were to be tabulated by the Finance Budget Sub-Committee of the Financial Advisory Committee to guide them in preparing a motion on the 2005 budget for consideration on Saturday, November 13th.

2005 BUDGET

THAT this Synod approve option 1 for the 2005 budget, but give \$22,000 to the Niagara Anglican and adjust the remaining short-term variable expenses by equal amounts.

The Chancellor ruled that this could not be considered an amendment to the motion on the floor and ruled it out of order.

THAT the cost of diocesan staff salaries, benefits, and travel be reduced by approximately 15% (or \$164,776) and that these savings be entirely reflected in reducing the costs for DMM.

The Chancellor ruled that this was not a proper motion and was out of order. This ruling was appealed and the appeal was defeated.
