- The Committee was sorry to lose the services of Karen Nowicki and Michael Patterson, now on new voyages and a welcome to our new associate at the 'Office' in Nancy Clause.
- While we have yet not achieved an increase in the number of Inspection teams retained
 I believe that we have developed a clear and fundamental approach to the
 requirements for reporting on each inspection base and these reports have flowed well
 and with a consistent measure of accuracy based on this Committees reviews.
- The Committee in association with Ian Chadwick, Chair of the Bishops Advisory Committee on Church Buildings, undertook a site review and Professional Engineering Review of the Structure and operation at St. Peter's in Hamilton. The inspection discovered relatively serious issues on roof areas as well as basement and electrical matters. Buchan Lawton and Parent, a Professional Structural Engineering Company, was retained to join us in that review. Their recommendations have been addressed by the Diocese.
